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







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Republic Day






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U Vaachan Prerna Diwas Celebration (14th October)






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
D Marathi Bhasha Diwas


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I Teachers' Day Celebration-5th September

Following this, VESIT students Rahul Ghorpade(D13), Kapil Kriplani(D15), Jatin Manglani(D18) and Chaitanya Kulkarni(D18) executed a wonderful drama, the script for which was written by Chaitanya Kulkarni.

It basically revolved around how our freedom fighters gave up their life for our nation and what would they think if they were here today. There was an argument about whose Singing Patriotic Tunes on Independence Day statue should be erected during Independence day, Gandhi-



jis or Sawarkarji's. The argument took place with both individuals giving their own reasons. 







Vishakha (poem) and Natsamrat (play) are among his most notable works.

't was a Saturday, the 27th of September 2014, and the United Nations General Assembly's 69th meeting was underway at the New York City headquarters. It was at this meeting, that our Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi proposed the idea of an International Yoga Day. Below is L the extract from his speech where he proposed the idea: Yoga is an invaluable gift of India's ancient tradition. It embodies unity of mind and body; thought and action; restraint

and fulfillment; harmony between man and nature; a holistic approach to health and well-being. It is not about exercise but to discover the sense of oneness with yourself, the world and the nature. By changing our lifestyle and creating con-

sciousness, it can help in well being. Let us work towards adopting an International Yoga Day." The word "Yoga" is derived from the Sanskrit term, "Yuj", which means to attach, to yoke, to align, to join, etc. It signifies the fusion of the soul with the Divine Creator. Yoga is basically a lifestyle which promotes good mental, physical and spiritual health. Following the disciplines of Yoga promotes vitality and immunity.

The origins of Yoga date back to Pre-Vedic India, although the proper development, implementation and propagation began in the 5th Century BC. According to ancient texts like the Upanishads, Gita, Patanjali Yoga Sutras, etc. Yoga is a spiritual state of mind where the senses are all muted and the body and mind experiences nothing whatsoever. This state is also called "Nirvana". The physical aspects of Yoga involve various exercises which each simulate a certain part of the body and the mind, including breathing exercises for the lung and stomach. Yoga even indicates the type of diet, medicines, etc that a follower of Yoga should follow to achieve healthy living. The ultimate goal of the Yoga lifestyle is to achieve Moksha, Dr. P.P Vaidya describing the asanas

Yoga has been scientifically proven to improve mental and physical fitness, stamina, flexibility and a stress-free psyche. Due to this, Westernisation of Yoga has taken place, with more and more people signing up for it, and impromptu events being held with considerable turnout. It has gained more of a physical context than spiritual in most of the world. People are practicing Yoga as an alternative to the gym and thus making it a part of their lives... It even helps cope with premenstrual syndrome. Children and teens are recommended Yoga alike adults to cope with increasing stress levels and emotional imbalances. Infact, a school district in California even obtained legal permission to introduce Yoga into their PE curriculum, going against certain parents who claimed that it was a religious practice. It is for all these reasons that the proposal for an International Yoga Day was received with much acclaim when introduced. On 11th December 2014, India's permanent representative Asoke Mukherji introduced the draft resolution in UNGA. It received support from 177 member states who co-sponsored it, making it the UNGA resolution of that nature with the highest ever sponsors. 21 June was also chosen because it was the longest day of the year in the northern hemisphere. Every year, massive celebrations take place in India and abroad, with more awareness being spread about it and making it a reason to talk about mental and physical health and their importance. Many of our leaders, spiritual gurus and celebrities recognize and celebrate this day as a mark of the impact of rich Indian culture onto the rest of the world.

On 21st June, Ms Piya Mukherjee, the Director of VESLARC (Vivekanand Education Society's Leadership Academy and Research Centre) which is a forum of around 20 teachers of VES institutes headed the yoga session for VES Institutes. The students and staff of Vivekanand Education Society's Institute of Technology celebrated International Yoga Day under the guidance of Dr. P. P. Vaidya, HOD, R&D Cell, VESIT. Mrs. Janhavi Padiyar initiated the introductory session by welcoming all as per the protocol established by the government. She initiated the event with a powerful praver filling the minds of all with gratitude. It was in this receptive state that the participants made a Sankalp :



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
