1.KOLHAPUR AND SANGLI FLOODS - DONATION DRIVE- 19th and 20th August 2019

SoRT VESIT in collaboration with VES Trust organized a donation drive to contribute to all those who are stranded and affected by the floods in Kolhapur and Sangli districts of western Maharashtra. It was a two-day drive with the primary objective of extending support to lakhs of people in the midst of a tremendous halt for weeks.

Students, teachers and parents donated food grains like dal, rice and wheat along with other edibles like packed biscuits. The drive was initiated immediately and the food grains collected were stored in the college. VES Trust office coordinated with the Office of District Collector to transport the grains for further process.

The total donations collected at the end of the drive were 201 kg of rice,100 kg of wheat and 58 kg of dal besides multiple boxes of biscuits which were contributed voluntarily by the students



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and faculty members. Everyone came together during the need of the hour as a community and the drive concluded on an extremely positive note.

4. E-waste Collection Drive: 7th February and 8th February

E-waste has been a major threat to the environment with very little knowledge of how to manage it. Most people have no idea of how to dispose of their e-waste in an eco-friendly manner and end up selling it to scrap dealers or worse, dumping it in garbage bins from where it most likely ends up in landfills. The improper disposal of electronic scrap, which contains toxic metals, leads to air and water pollution, exposure to which can cause severe health problems.

SoRT VESIT organized an E-waste collection drive with an aim to spread major awareness about the lesser-known hazards of electronic waste generated in our country. As a part of this initiative, we collected old, non-repairable and non-functional electronic waste material such as batteries, earphones, computer accessories, cables, stereos, television remotes, calculators, etc during these 2 days and ensured that the material is handed-over to authorized agencies in their mission to recycle and refurbish the electronic waste products.

The Social Responsibility Team successfully carried out this drive and managed to collect a whopping amount of 35 kgs of electronic waste which was sent for recycling. E-waste was brought in by the students as well as the staff members as a contribution to solving this growing ecological problem.



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7. Unnat Bharat Abhiyan: 26th September to 1st October 2019

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is a flagship program of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. It is inspired by the vision of transformational change in the rural areas of India through the means of development by the influence of the premier institutions in order to formulate and architect an Inclusive India.

The foremost mission of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is to enable and equip the higher educational institutions to work alongside people of rural India in order to bridge the major developmental disconnections between rural and urban sectors. This program would aid the institutes in identifying development challenges and conceiving innovative solutions in order to accelerate growth. All five teams had the same primary objective in their first visit, which was to conduct a survey of these villages and to understand the problems faced by the village and its inhabitants. Some of the teams also managed to conduct a few other activities.

The comprehensive plan of action as per the given guidelines were:

- 1) Formation of UBA Cell or committee as per the interest (Faculties and Students)
- 2) Primary visit with UBA team and discussion with Village people.
- 3) Awareness program to be conducted about UBA in every village.
- 4) Report on every visit and it's copy to be sent to IIT Delhi.
- 5) Feasible solution for every problem
- 6) Implementation of planned activity with UBA team.

Linking the learning activities of students of VES to the SDGs

While VES is committed towards all the above Principles, there has been a special emphasis on linking our activities to some of the 17 SDGs, based on the perceived needs of local stakeholders, the contemporary context of education in India, and the unique challenges seen in the socio-cultural mileu of Mumbai. The aim is to sensitize our students, the future citizens of the world, so that they may adopt sustainable practices as the bedrock of all activities.

Some of the SDGs which have had a special focus for us, are:

- 1. SDG 1 No Poverty
- 2. SDG 2 No Hunger
- 3. SDG 3 Good Health
- 4. SDG 4- Quality Education
- SDG 5 Gender Equality
- 6. SDG 12 Responsible Consumption
- 7. SDG 13 Climate Action
- 8. SDG 16 Peace and Justice

Some of the activities and approaches adopted by VES, towards the fulfilling the above goals are listed here. Since VES has 27 institutes, the following is only an indicative list. Some of the unique activities appear in bold font. The detailed description of our activities, appear in the pages that follow.

SDG 1 – No Poverty

Raising of financial resources for the economically challenged, collection of pre-used clothes and other items for distribution to the needy. Yuva for Seva is another such intiative, aimed towards bridging the needs-resources gap, via student intervention, through Non Government Organisations (NGOs) and similar bodies.

2. SDG 2 - No Hunger

Distribution of food-grains to the underprivileged, food collection and distribution at orphanages and similar shelters for the economically or socially challenged. Older

students are encouraged to use the "Profits with Principles" thinking for creating economically viable solutions to challenges faced in the local contexts.

SDG 3 – Good Health

Various awareness camps, plays, workshops and sessions to minimize if not eradicate use of tobacco. Awareness about tuberculosis, HIV / AIDS, sharing of inputs on everyday health through yogasana and simple yet holistic health practices. Blood donation camps, cornea donation camps, creation of blood donors' registry and screening for various diseases and health disorders, for students, staff and local citizens around the VES campuses, form part of this endeavour. Cleanliness endeavours, such as the "Swacch Bharat Abhiyaan" (Clean India Project) are adopted by the various VES institutes. Examples of actions include cleaning of the local areas, cleaning of the local railway stations and cleaning of the VES campuses.

SDG 4- Quality Education

Values-linked and skill-focused education imparted to students from the ages of 3 till their mid-twenties, with the aim of empowering productive and responsible, job-ready global citizens. Every year, scholarships and grants are awarded to meritorious students who are financially challenged. Workshops are conducted to sensitize parents of students who belong to economically challenged strata of society, emphasizing the need for education, and the importance of familial values for social progress and harmony.

Indian-values based learnings, via regular as well as periodic lectures, events and workshops, including Vedantic learning, also forms part of this goal. The objective is to create mental-emotional resilience along with technical skills.

SDG 5 – Gender Equality

Students are encouraged to integrate gender equal approaches via short talks and sensitization workshops. Women's Development Cells of the various Institutes help to disseminate **special inputs for women, such as self-defence and assertive communication and behavior**. Street plays, and poster competitions to save the girl child, also form part of such initiatives.

The 3 Rs mantra is embedded into the thinking and activities of students and staff of VES in various ways. Reduction of use of electricity, reduction of wastage of water caused by avoidable drips and reduction of usage of paper, to avoid the felling of trees, are some of the commonly adopted approaches.

7. SDG 13 - Climate Action

Converting one of the VES campuses into a **Zero-Waste campus**, segregating of wet and dry waste, using organic waste to prepare natural manure and fertilizers, planting of trees in the central courtyard of another campus – these are some of the myriad ways in which sustainability in terms of climate action, is incorporated into our activities.

SDG 16 – Peace and Justice

Conducting workshops on gerontology and care of senior citizens, and conducting **free legal-aid camps for the benefit of local citizens** who may not have access to quality legal care or may not be able to afford the same, are some of the activities that are aimed towards this goal.

Google class room concept implemented this year in some classes improved teacher student communication and rapport. The regular Faculty Devolopment Programs, the Induction programme for new teachers and Adharsila, collaborative teamwork of VES teachers mentored by VES Leadership and Re-Search Academy motivate the teachers to experiment with the new methodologies.

Skill Enhancement Lectures (SEL) are being arranged in all subjects to weave supportive knowledge as needed throughout the curriculum. The valuable guidance from Department Advisory Boards (DAB) consisting of industry Experts, Parents, Alumni and students is also taken into account in the formulation of new schemes and in the modification of existing schemes. The Centre of Excellence labs created in the institute such as Labview Academy of National Instruments, Big data Analytics lab with Cloudera, VLSI lab with Cadence, Wireless lab with D Link provides opportunity to our students to learn the upcoming technologies

Drawing inspiration from the above way of thought, the third SIP report of Vivekanand Education Society (VES), for the year 2018-19, reflects a wide spectrum of Sustainable development Goal (SDG) choices, for its constituent colleges, as well as its other schools and colleges. The objective is to work towards a cleaner, healthier, happier planet, through the various SDGs.

So, for example, if the students of engineering have chosen to work on various projects that leverage technology for the economically underprivileged (SDG 9 for Industry , Innovation and Infrastructure), the students of pharmacy have opted to take health-awareness processes to the wider society (SDG 3, for Good Health and Wellbeing), and students of law have worked on free legal camps for dissemination of information about essential legal rights, to the common man (SDG 16 for building peaceful, just and equitable society).

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VES Institute of Technology (VESIT)

The sustainability-linked activities of VESIT focused on two broad areas – leveraging technological expertise for helping the economically underprivileged and sensitizing students towards broader social responsibilities.

In the first focus area, where technology is used for sustainability, students were encouraged to select academic projects that carried a positive social impact. Some of these include:

- An underground drainage monitoring system, that helps determine the percentage of oxygen and other gases inside a drain
- A smart parking system with automation for display of available parking
- E-governance of water consumption for record-keeping, tracking and analysis
- · The design for a prosthetic limb for easy and effortless movement

Several teams, consisting of four members each, participated, and made some innovative and eco-friendly dustbins.
- 8. Mock Fire Drill- SoRT VESIT collaborated with Freedom4u foundation and organized a safety drill in the college. Before the drill, the class representatives and the SoRT and Sports council members were called to the auditorium and given instructions. They were divided into teams which were responsible for their particular tasks, such as search and rescue team, transportation team, fire extinguisher team, first aid team, etc. After the session was dismissed, the instructors raised a mock alarm, minutes after which the entire college was evacuated in a organized manner. The fire extinguisher team was instructed to get all the fire-extinguishers from the college, and the use of these to extinguish fires was demonstrated. Instructions were also given on how to deal with casualties.
