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Report on Beach Cleaning on Dadar Beach

Dadar Beach is a popular beach located in Mumbai, India. Over the years, the beach has become increasingly polluted due to littering and improper waste disposal. To combat this issue, regular beach cleaning drives are arranged by the faculties and students of Vivekananda Education Society's Institute of Technology, Mumbai in collaboration with Mr. Jay Shringupuria.

The drive was arranged this time by the Department of Humanities and Applied Sciences in collaboration with UHV Club of college with the objective of raising awareness among the students about the importance of keeping the environment clean and reducing the amount of plastic waste that ends up in the ocean.

The drive was part of a larger initiative by the institution to promote sustainable practices and environmental awareness among its students.

The students of the Department of Humanities and Applied Sciences along with the Assistant Professors Dr. Pooja Kundu, Ms. Ramya Tirumalshetty and Dr. Sushil Dhuldhar arrived at the beach early in the morning at 7.45 a.m. armed with gloves, masks, and trash bags. They spent two hours collecting litter, including plastic bottles, food wrappers, polythenes, milk packets, plastic sacks etc. from the beach and its surrounding areas. The professors also interacted with beachgoers, educating them about the importance of keeping the environment clean and reducing the use of plastic. A lot of plastic waste was collected. After the beach cleaning drive the students were provided with breakfast.

The oath campaign was organized and all students and faculty members were asked to submit their acceptance of healthy life and keep themselves away from Addiction in any form.

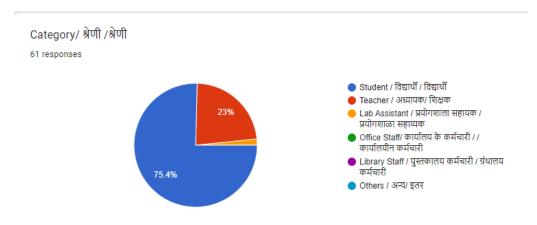


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The VESIT Community was asked to provide their support by signing the Pledge to confirm their support for the No-Tobacco campaign.

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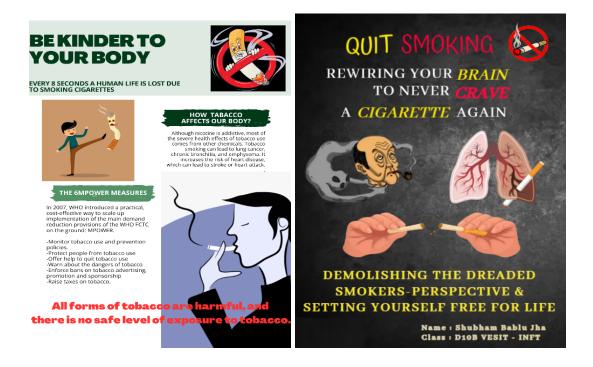


Fig 10: Display of poster on ill effects of Tobacco



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Detailed Report

STREET PLAY ON ANTI RAGGING AND ANTI SEXUAL HARASSMENT

The Cultural Council 22-23 under the guidance of Cultural In-charges: Mr. Prasad Godse, Dr. Rohini Temkar & Dr. Nandini Ammangi conducted a street play on Anti Ragging and Anti Sexual Harassment on 13th March 2023 at 12:45 pm in Amphitheatre.

Street play was performed by Ameya Roplekar (D11), Soham Shetye (D10A), Ayush Singh (D9B), Harsh Shah (D4A), Sanchit Kulkarni (D1EC), Shreyas Akmanchi (D4B), Soham Tawade (D7C) and Swayam Gaikwad (D6AD). Kaustubh Natalkar (D4B) was also a part of street play who used the Clapbox to give beats for the dialogues.

As the title itself suggests, the street play mainly focused on spreading awareness regarding Ragging and Sexual Harassment happening on and off the campus. It portrayed a short story of 2 young boys played by Shreyas and Sanchit who've just joined the college and how the seniors (Ameya and Ayush) try to rag them.

Seniors abuse juniors racially and make them dance and sing forcefully.

The juniors feel very embarrassed and lose all hope and confidence as this was happening with them every day. One day, a student (Soham) counseled the juniors not to keep quiet and complained to the anti ragging cell. The boy gathered courage and filed a complaint against them to the anti ragging cell of the college. The Anti ragging cell caught the seniors red handed the next day while ragging and handed them over to the police.

After this, a scene was shown where a girl (Played by Soham) from a far away town joins the college, where she encounters some boys(Ayush Ameya) following and gazing at her daily. One day as she was returning home, the boys went behind her and tried to sexually abuse her. She was very traumatized by this incident and didn't attend the college for a few days.

Her friend (Harsh) got to know about this and he motivated and pushed her to complain about them, but she was scared by the societal effect it'll have on her image. Harsh explained to her why it's important to complain against these people and stop this culture from spreading more. On complaining, the boys were immediately taken to the police custody.

Swayam and Harsh played the roles of orators who were giving information regarding the scenes in between



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At the end, all the important helpline numbers regarding anti ragging cell and anti sexual harassment cell were displayed. The actors gave a befitting message about these topics and exclaimed why we shouldn't overshadow them and go against these things. The Street play ended up with a pledge about Anti Ragging and Anti Sexual Harassment.

The ideation of the street play was done by the Drama Head Ameya Roplekar and was set under the guidance of Cultural Faculty In-charges.

It was an 8 minute long Street play that received a great response, video was recorded of the same and was circulated all over the college for those who missed it.
