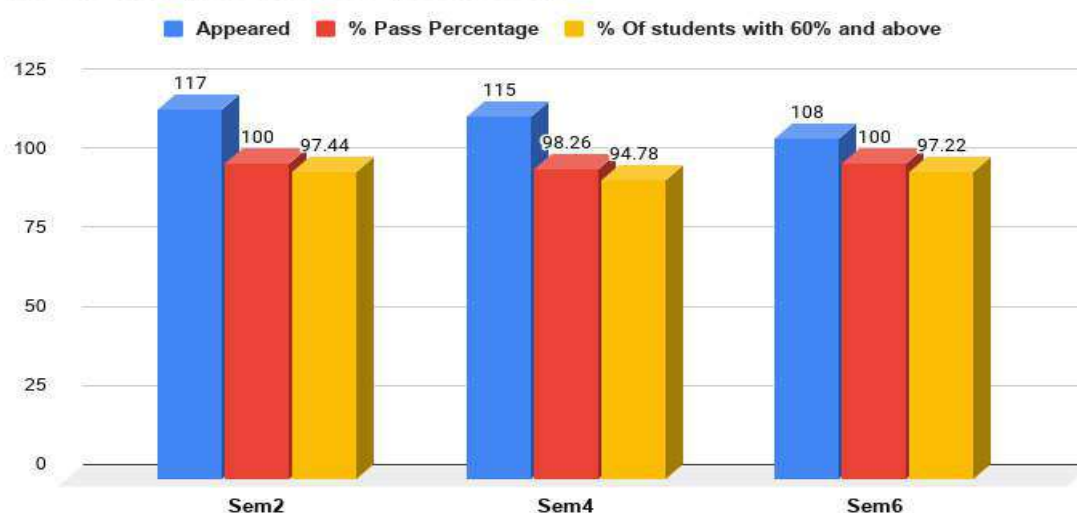

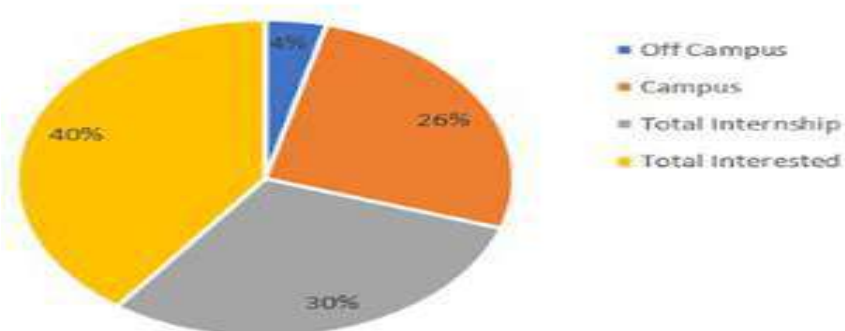
Result Analysis 2019-20 (Even Sem)

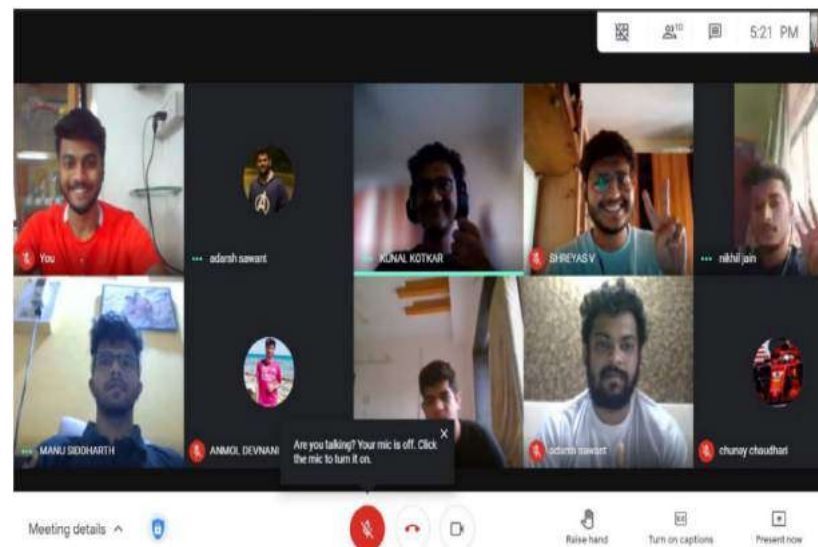
## Extra Curricular

## Cricket ball tapping:

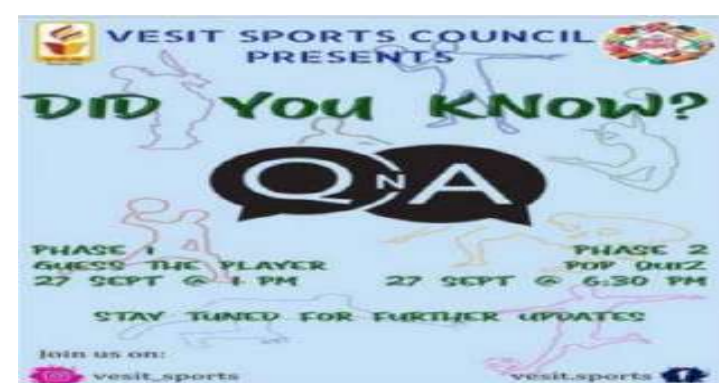
Participants had to tap the ball on bat as many times as possible in a time limit of 1 minute.

**Respect = Right Evaluation**, Whenever the evaluation is not right (over evaluation/under evaluation), it is Disrespect.

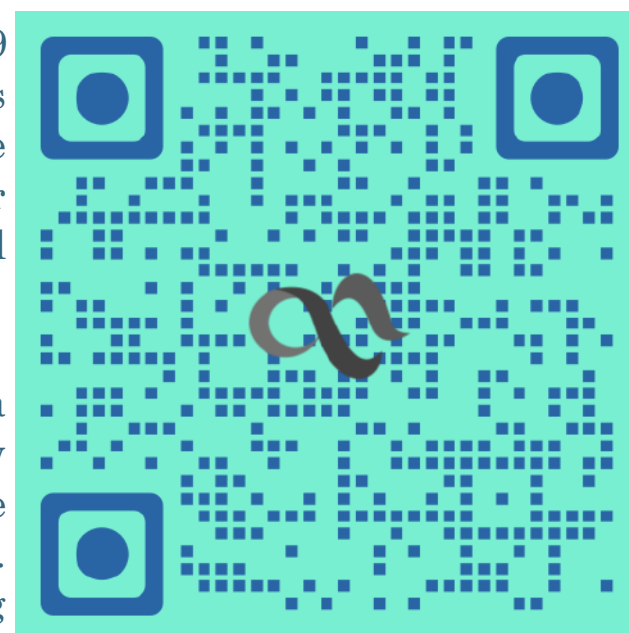

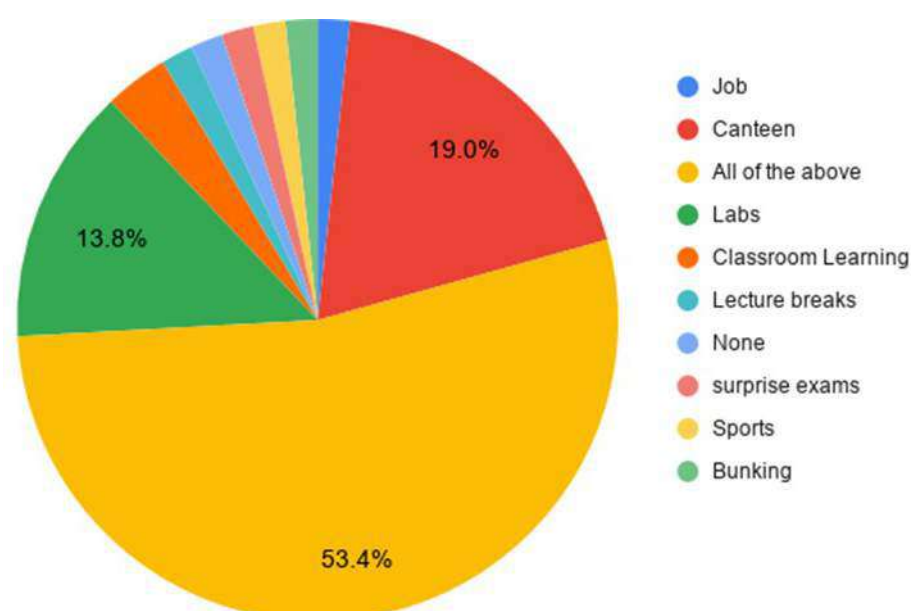

## PROF. NISHI TIKU & VESIT...

Nishi Tiku joined VES Institute in the year 1986 and got superannuation from Head of Department of MCA in the year 2020. In 34 years, being a part of VES Institute Nishi Tiku Ma'am is known for her calm, poised personality whilst stepping up in the game at every opportunity. This is a small piece of her life at VES Institute in her own words

### ◆ How was your working Experience at VESIT?

V.E.S.I.T to me has been a second home for almost 34 years, since 1986. Long time though, to me it doesn't seem so. My experience at V.E.S.I.T has been engaging and at times challenging, there has hardly been a day without a challenge. I have walked many a corridors of V.E.S.I.T to fulfill my roles and responsibilities in various committees, those of the Department /University, subjects I have taught, or the departments that I have been with or for that matter the buildings from where I have functioned. I have taught more than thirty subjects across various disciplines in college. I have been a part of the syllabus committee and on the examiner's panel of the University of Mumbai for most of these subjects. I have been successful in introducing a couple of new subjects into the curriculum of MCA at M.U. Let me mention here as Head of the department one is actually in a sandwich program between the higher-ups and staff, higher-ups and students and staff and students which I think I have sailed through successfully to a larger extent.

### ◆ How was your first day in MCA dept different from last day? And What type of challenges did you face along the way?

In my opinion my transfer to the MCA department proved to be quite fruitful and satisfactory to both the college and myself. Well, the first day in the department was a day of unknown, getting transferred to the youngest one of its siblings at V.E.S.I.T and a post graduate to add to that. There was a lot much to do.... We were shifted to the present MMS building (all of it to ourselves then), lock and barrel with a few faculty members commuting between the two campuses for taking lectures. Being away from the main Campus at Sindhi Society posed a lot many hardships initially which I did anticipate in the first few days but sailed through them successfully probably because of the hard training regime that a few of us had undergone under the earlier director Dr. Miss Saxena. Least to say that I left the department with a sense of great achievement and satisfaction as far as the department growth is concerned. We were now well equipped with top ranks in academics, placements, technical nontechnical skills, co-curricular activities along with a department full of experienced and well qualified teaching and non teaching staff. Attained my superannuation on 31st March 2020. Well, this day shall be etched in history, not because it's a special day to me but for the COVID19 lockdown that forced us all to be home bound. I went to college on 15th March 2020 last, after which the college was closed temporarily ..... permanently for me.

### ◆ What was your favorite thing about being a professor? And What do you think are the most important attributes of a good instructor?

See, a teacher's work does not involve only teaching particularly at a distinguished technical institution like ours. It's the combined effort and hard work of teachers and students and the devotion to quality and dedication of teachers and vision of the management which is responsible for notable achievements. We also need to see how and when during a student's tenure in a professional college do we add to his/her overall growth as a professional to be employed and to sustain that successfully and ethically.





Leadership and learning are indispensable of each other, it is our commitment here to create leaders that our society and world needs through dedicated education that takes place here. Envisaging all this and putting forth such proposals and getting them started and with appreciation for the benefit of students and staff always bring in happiness and pride, these automatically become a teachers favorite things and important attributes of a good instructor/ guide/ mentor. Responding to the bright young faces every morning with an assuring “Good morning” and each year when our facts n figures showed more than 90% of our department students were placed would be a favorite thing. Being with my students, and some of my friends and of course my tea breaks which I would look forward to adds to the list.

◆ **What is your proudest professional accomplishment?**

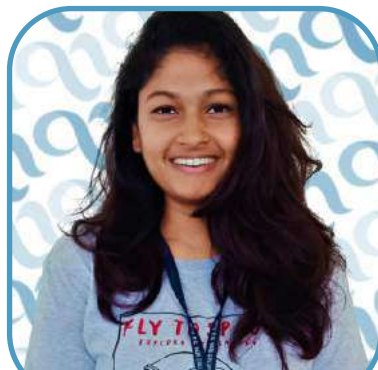
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
